





Industry Pathways



More opportunities for students.

Currently, the South Australian Government is offering more opportunities for students.

This means eligible students can:

- Access this course or more regardless of their prior **(+)** qualifications undertake more than one course or short course.
- School-enrolled students are entitled to access one Certificate Il and one Certificate III course while at school.

Some creatives maybe eligible for funding opportunities for the following qualifications:

CUA51020 Diploma of Screen and Media SHB20216 Certificate II in Salon Assistant SHB20121 Certificate II in Retail Cosmetics SHB30121 Certificate III in Beauty Services

A student may be eligible for a subsidised training place if they live or work in South Australia, and:

- Are an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or
- Are a permanent Australian resident, or
- Hold a state sponsored visa on a pathway to permanent residency (see Eligible visa types) https://providers.skills.sa.gov.au/ subsidised-training

and are:

16 years or over and not enrolled at school.




